



RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR BOYS' AND GIRLS' GOLF

I. COMPETITION

- A. Six members of each team will play, with the best four scores being counted.
- B. Points earned for order of finish in conference meets will count in division standings only.
- C. If a tie exists, the fifth best players' scores will be used. If the tie is not broken, the sixth best players' scores will be used. If the match is still tied, all six players on each team will participate in a play-off. At the end of the first play-off hole, the four best scores of each team will be used to determine a winner. If a tie still exists, the fifth best scores will be used, and if a tie still exists the sixth best scores will be used. The play-off hole will be determined by the coach of the home team.
- D. The coach of the home team is responsible for:
 - 1. establishing playing rules, e.g., pick and clean, leaf rule, etc.
 - 2. notifying his opponent where the match will be played.
- E. Both coaches must agree when a match should be stopped due to the weather. If play is resumed, it must begin after the last completed hole.
- F. In accordance with MAC Athletic By-Laws, Article XI, Letter E., seniors may not participate on a JV team unless previously approved by a vote of all member schools.
- G. Coaching will be allowed from the green to the tee only. Coaches may give rule advice, but no rulings while players are on the course.

II. SCHEDULING

- A. All teams will play a round-robin, home-and-home schedule in their divisions. Division matches will be played on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- B. A 2-year schedule will be established. In the second year of the 2-year schedule, the home and away contests will be opposite those in the first.
- A. A conference meet for MAC teams will be held.
- D. If a match is cancelled, the coach of the home team must notify his opponent by 1:00P.M. if possible.



E. All make-ups are to be scheduled at the earliest possible date.

III. AWARDS

A. A plaque will be awarded to the dual match championship team in each division, and certificates will be given to the members of championship teams.

B. A conference tournament will be held, and a plaque given to the championship team in each division.

C. If the same team wins both the division meet and the dual meet championship only 1 plaque will be awarded to that school.

A. The coaches will conduct their post-season meeting at the conclusion of the division tournament.

B. All-conference players will be chosen by the following procedure:

1. Coaches will meet, by division, on the day of the conference meet, and nominate All-conference candidates. If questions arise regarding the candidates, the order of finish in the conference tournament will determine the final selection.
2. All-conference players will receive a medal.
3. The number of selections in each division will be determined by the following formula:

Six (6) entries (in division meet) x .25 x no. teams in the division

e.g., in an eight team division: $6 \times .25 \times 8 = 12$

C. Each division will identify a League Medalist. The League Medalist will receive a medal at the division tournament.

D. Each sport will honor an all-academic team. All varsity team members who earn a GPA of 3.0 or better during their season of competition will receive a certificate. Fall sports will use first quarter grades to compute the GPA
